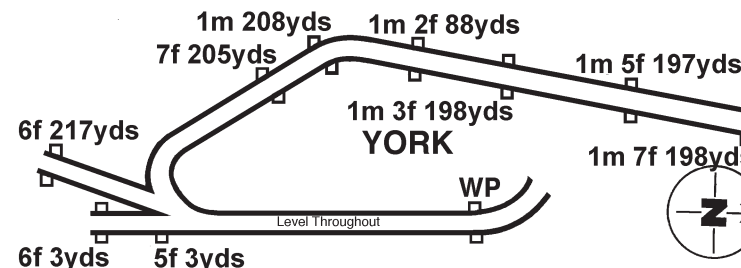

The jockeys listed are those declared to ride at the time of going to press and are subject to amendment. The weights, owners' and trainers' names, and the colours to be worn by jockeys, have been added for convenience and are not guaranteed to be correct.

York is a left-handed, U-shaped course, two miles in extent, and quite flat throughout. There is also a perfectly flat straight course over which all five-furlong and six-furlong races are run. Seven-furlong races start on a spur which joins the round course after about two furlongs. The run-in from the turn is nearly five furlongs. This is one of the best courses in the country, of great width throughout and with a sweeping turn into the long straight. The entire absence of surface undulations makes it ideal for a long-striding, resolute galloper, but it really is a splendid track, bestowing no great favours on any type of horse.



DRAW: The draw has seemed of little significance on the straight course recently, a prominent pitch early on often more significant. In good-size fields low numbers tend to fare better than high in races at up to a mile, though a prominent position on the turn often seems of more importance than the draw itself.


STALLS: Centre – straight course.
